C63.18: C63.18-2014 On-site, Ad-Hoc Test Method for Estimating Radiated Electromagnetic Immunity of Medical Devices to Specific Radio Frequency Transmitters Contact: Silberberg, Jeffrey L (Working Group Chair)

Scope: This recommended practice is a guide to evaluating the electromagnetic immunity of medical devices to radiated radio-frequency (RF) emissions from common RF transmitters (e.g., two-way radios; walkie-talkies; mobile phones; wireless-enabled tablets, e-readers, laptop computers, and similar devices; radio-frequency identification (RFID) readers; networked mp3 players; two-way pagers; and wireless personal digital assistants [PDAs])..

Status: Current. No plans for further maintenance at this time.

8.2 C63.19: Hearing Aid Compatibility - Stephen Berger

C63.19: C63.19-2011 American National Standard for Methods of Measurement of Compatibility between Wireless Communications Devices and Hearing Aids

Contact: Berger, Stephen (Working Group Chair)

Scope: Uniform methods of measurement for compatibility between hearing aids and wireless communications devices are set forth.

Status: Current. New revision being developed. An explanation or interpretation is available.

8.3 C63.33: David Schaefer

It was announced that David Schaefer is stepping down as WG chair.

AI - Stephen Berger took an action item to find a new chair and vice-chair for the C63.33 WG.

It was also announced that a letter has been received by AdvaMed expressing a set of concerns with the C63.33 standard as currently being pursued.

Significant discussion follows that included potential leadership for the C63.33 WG and the how this project fits into existing standards, particularly IEC 60601-1-2 Amendment 1.

Important points discussed were:

- The IEC 60601-1-2 standard has a different approach to risk management than that in ANSI C63.27. The approach used in ANSI C63.33 has yet to be determined.
- It was noted that IEC 60601-1-2 Amendment 1, was passed in 2020, covers down to 134.2 kHz and claims to cover EAS (Electronic Article Surveillance) devices.

- It was also noted that while those involved with C63.33 thought that the PINS received no comments, in fact there were comments. The explanation is that comments were misrouted and did not become known to ANSI C63 until recently.
- It was also reported that all IEC 60601-1's are being integrated into IEC 60601-1 and all part 2's are being revised to reflect the changes in the part 1's. A result of this is that none of the part 1's will be changed until after the process is complete.

Stephen Berger reported on his efforts to open a dialogue with AdvaMed. After discussion he was given the following **Action Items**:

- Arrange for a telecon with AdvaMed to discuss their concerns with C63.33.
- Issue new calls for participation in C63.33, particularly targeting test laboratories and medical device manufacturers and to include the accreditation bodies.
